
## What would you put in your own museum?

This is a cross curricular topic. The children will learn about changes within living memory – what household items and toys our grandparents/great grandparents had. We will also focus on hot areas of the world and the equator.

In Computing we will be using the app 'Book creator' during our 'Puzzling Times' unit. We will be creating a fun puzzle game that would appeal to younger children. The children will create characters and design their own games.



In English we will continue to follow Pathways to Write. We will be focussing on the stories The Lion Inside by Rachel Bright and The Curious Case of the Missing Mammoth by Ellie Hattie. We will continue to punctuate sentences using capital letters and a full stop, some question marks and exclamation marks. Another focus will be on using 'and' between words and some clauses. We will move onto the prefix un- and the accurate use of suffixes (where no change is needed to the root of the word) e.g. -ed, -ing, -er, -est. We will write simple sentences in sequence and include a beginning, middle and end in our writing.







In Maths we will be looking at Number: Addition and Subtraction within 20 and Place value (within 50). We will look at numbers from 11 to 50. We will move onto tens and ones and will add by counting on.

The children will revisit numbers bonds and continue to find one more and one less than a given number.

They will count in 2s, 5s and 10s and subtract crossing 10.

In Geography we will be identifying seasonal change and weather patterns in the UK. We will also focus on the location of hot areas of the world in relation to the Equator. We will study Africa and recognise similarities and differences to our area.

In History we will learn about Changes within living memory. We will focus on what household items and toys our grandparents/great grandparents had.



In R.E we will be looking at Christianity. We will be focussing on the world around us and what makes it beautiful. We will study the Creation story and why it is important to some people. We will be thinking of ways in which we could care for our world and immediate environment.

In P.E we will focus on Gymnastics and Dance. We will explore and develop skills, actions and movements and use control and movement to perform.

In Music we will be looking at different styles of music - Blues, Latin, Folk, Funk, Baroque, Bhangra. We will be singing and learning simple songs.







In Art we will create self-portraits to display in our own gallery/museum we will experiment with line, shape and colour.

In DT we will design and make an animal mask – we will select tools and use lots of different skills: cutting, shaping, joining, finishing and selecting materials.

In Science we will be identifying seasonal change and weather patterns in the UK and other countries. We will look at weather symbols and produce our own weather reports! We will make weather measuring instruments and will observe changes over time. We will identify the changes over the 4 seasons. We will move onto describing and comparing a variety of common animals.
