What is StarLine?

StarLine is a national home learning helpline that gives parents and carers direct access to a team of **qualified teachers**, and education and parenting experts who can provide free personalised advice, support and reassurance.

StarLine has been set up to help young people to continue to learn and stay safe until schools fully re-open.

How can StarLine help?

- Providing practical ideas, support and reassurance.
- Offering tips, techniques and resources to give children the support they need to continue learning while schools are closed.
- Covering all phases of education and subjects plus behaviour, pupil wellbeing and SEND.
