

Forests or caves – where would you like to live?

Year 4 Learning Leaflet

Summer 2021

In **Science** this term, we will be focusing on Electricity and Living things and their habitats. We will link this to our topic of 'Planet Earth'. We will be carrying out investigations and exploring new ideas.

In **DT** we will learn about different fruits from the forest and we will create our own fruit salad.



In **English** we will be using the books: Where the Forest Meets the Sea and Blue John. This term we will continue to focus on ambitious vocabulary, fronted adverbials, dramatic openers and using a variety of interesting punctuation. We will be writing in a variety of ways, looking to refine our skills for both fiction and non-fiction. Within our thematic approach to learning there will be lots of exciting speaking and listening opportunities from role play to debates.

In **Maths** we will be embracing the new National Curriculum, looking at:

- Geometry: Properties of Shape
- Geometry: Position and Direction
- Decimals
- Statistics: Interpreting and presenting data using bar charts and time graphs.
- Measurement: Money and Time.

In **R.E** we will continue learning about Humanism and Hinduism. Within these units, we will be able to describe and make connections between different features of the religions and worldviews we have studied. We will discuss celebrations, worship, pilgrimages and rituals which mark important points in life and reflect on ideas.

In **French**, our topic is based on the hungry giant. This will include describing fruits and vegetables and finding how to ask politely for these items. We will continue to develop our skills in conversational French and learn about French culture.

In **Music** our topic is called the Blackbird. All the learning in this unit is focused around one song: Blackbird by The Beatles - a song about civil rights.



In **P.E** we will be covering athletics, tag rugby, cricket and rounders. We will be developing skills in all sports and playing games. This term we are hoping Sports Day can go ahead so we can develop our competitive sportsmanship and sharing our sporting talents.



Our **Geography** this term will involve us learning and sharing information about rivers linked to the Amazon River. We will be learning about river formations and the water cycle. We will look closely at our local river - the River Dee and compare and contrast it to the Amazon River in South America.
