## Year 3 Learning Letter Spring 2017

## Our topic will focus on Disasters

In Science this term, we will be focusing on Volcanoes (we will be reading 'The Secrets of Vesuvius') and States of Matter. We will be investigate how volcanoes are formed and explore solids, liquids and

In Art we will learn about Roman Mosaics. We will plan and design our own Roman Mosaic tile. In DT we will participate in our very own Roman Banquet. We will also research, design and make a Roman Sandal.

In English we will be reading 'Winter's Child' where we will explore the cold and frosty elements of Winter, identify key features of a quest story or fable and create character profiles using our description skills. During this topic children will learn how to sequence and write a fable where a new main character has to go on a journey. The grammar we will cover in this half term will include noun phrases - fantastic description to interest the reader, conjunctions - to link and extend sentences, adverbials fascinating sentence openers, prepositions and direct speech.



In Maths we will be embracing the new National Curriculum looking at:

- Shape identifying the different groups of shapes and comparing their key features.
- Additive Reasoning: the relationship between addition and subtraction.
  Comparing measures. One and two step problems.
- Number Sense: recognising, adding and subtracting and comparing fractions.

In R.E we will be learning about the Islamic religion, focusing on family life and Allah. In Spring One we will look at Allah - understanding how he is admired.

In Spring Two we will delve into Muslim family life.





In P.E we are fortunate enough to have a gymnastics coach teaching us this term. She will work alongside Miss Hughes to develop your balance, coordinating, agility and flexibility skills. We also swap over swimming teams and practise our different swimming strokes and survival techniques.

Our **History and Geography** this term will be taught through a creative topic approach, where we will look at the impact on Britain through the invasion of the Romans. Alongside this, we will explore and investigate disasters involving volcanoes. We will continue to develop enquiry skills, chronology and build upon our knowledge of maps and atlases.



In French we will continue to work on the topic 'All about me' and begin to learn counting, days and months of the year - so we can say our birthdays in French.

In Computing we will be looking at Coding. This involves using a keyboard to input and control a game. You will learn how to sequence codes to create simple games.
