Year 3 Learning Letter
Spring 2018

Our topic will focus on Local History

In Science this term, we will be focusing on Living Things and their Habitats. You will be needed to become experts in the use of classification keys to help group, identify and name a variety of living things!

In Art we will look at canal boats and how we can use watercolours to create certain effects. In DT we will develop our skills in textiles by looking at the structures of canals/boats.

In English we will be reading The Snowy Dragon and Ape. This term we will identify key features of non-chronological reports, diary entries, poems and create character profiles using our description skills. The grammar we will cover in this term will include noun phrases - fantastic description to interest the reader, conjunctions - to link and extend sentences, adverbials - fascinating sentence openers, prepositions and direct speech.




In Maths we will be following the White Rose Maths Scheme which develops the children's fluency with number and their mastery at applying these skills to reasoning and problem solving. We will be focusing on:

- Multiplication and division we will be carrying on with multiplication and division. We will be multiplying and dividing two digits by one digit.
- Measurement: money.
- Number Sense: recognising, adding and subtracting and comparing fractions.

In R.E we will be learning about Sikhism, in particular about the founder Guru Nanak. We will discuss the importance of Sikhism and read stories relating to the religion.

In Music we will have weekly sessions on a Friday afternoon. We will be following the Charanga theme which allows children to focus on each aspect of the musical curriculum.





In French we will continue to work on the topic 'All about me' and begin to learn counting, days and months of the year - so we can say our birthdays in French.



Our History and Geography this term will be taught through our topic of Local History. We will learn about the history of Ellesmere Port, looking closely at the National Waterways boat museum and Thomas Telford (a civil engineer). We will develop our understanding of Canals and river formations and the different transportation methods used.

In P.E we will continue to develop our balance, coordination, agility, team work and flexibility skills. PE takes place on a Monday and Tuesday afternoon so please make sure you have your PE kit for those days.

In Computing this term we will learning about digital media.
