Parent Questionnaire About 30 Hours Free Childcare for 3 and 4 year olds.



Background:

All 3 and 4 year olds are currently entitled to up to 15 hours free childcare per week the term after they are 3 (there is no eligibility criteria as this is a universal offer). However, if you are a working parent you may be able to increase your free childcare entitlement from 15 hours to 30 hours per week for your 3 or 4 year old child from September, 2017.

For the purposes of this criteria:

- A 'parent' means a person who has parental responsibility for the child, or cares for the child. In cases where a parent has remarried or is living with a partner, the step-parent or partner must also meet the earnings threshold. Foster carers are eligible for the extended entitlement if they meet the criteria set out below for their own children. Foster carers are not eligible for the extended entitlement for the children that they foster.
- Working parents includes employed persons, self-employed persons and parents on zero hours contracts who meet the criteria.

Eligibility criteria to increase your free childcare entitlement to 30 hours per week:

Both parents are working (or the sole parent in a lone parent family is working) subject to the following criteria:

- Each parent (or sole parent) has a weekly minimum income equivalent to at least 16 hours at national minimum wage and neither parent (or sole parent) has an income of more than £100k per year. At present hourly wage rates vary, therefore you may be eligible if you earn the equivalent to:
 - A. Over 24 year olds on National Living Wage of \pounds 7.20 an hour the minimum income requirement is \pounds 115.20 a week.
 - B. 21 to 24 year olds on National Minimum Wage of £6.70 an hour the minimum income requirement is £107.20 a week.
 - C. 18 to 21 year olds receiving \pounds 3.87 an hour the minimum income requirement is \pounds 61.92 a week.
- Both parents are employed but one or both parents is temporarily away from the workplace on parental, adoption, maternity or paternity leave, on statutory sick pay.
- One parent is employed and one parent has substantial caring responsibilities based on specific benefits received for caring.
- One parent is employed and one parent is disabled or incapacitated based on receipt of specific benefits.
