Dear Parents/Guardians

Changes to the Times of the School Day

Friends of Elton

We are also saying goodbye to two amazing friends of the school. Clare Wright and Louise Hardwick have been unsung heroes of our school for many, many years. They have been the organisational experts behind every school disco, every film night, every sleepover, every Summer and Christmas fair and every Year 6 leavers evening. However, their roles extend well beyond this. They source funding from local industries and access grants to help fund things like our outdoor classroom areas; they funded and designed our ELSA room, and most recently have given our PPA area an amazing redesign: making the rooms much more welcoming for staff, visitors and children. Beyond that they have helped us to paint and decorate both the outside and inside of the school – and carpet the classrooms! During the lockdowns they played the key role in getting funding for the educational materials we delivered out to the children and then they delivered them out to families – along with





free school meals and laptops! I'm sure I've missed loads from this list too! All of this as unpaid voluntary work!

Clare and Louise have decided that it is now time for them to move on: both have started new jobs recently and their children left our school many years ago. I will greatly miss the tremendous support they have given me personally and the school community as a whole.

At our last disco we were well supported by some parents who volunteered to help out. We really appreciate this support – which allows us to put on these nice events for the children. On Thursday 31st March at 5:30 there will be a meeting at school for any parents who are interested in volunteering to take over the Friends of Elton role. Everyone is welcome to attend.

Hopefully we will be able to invite Louise and Clare into school next half-term for a proper send off from the school community...I just need someone to help me plan that, they always did those events too! Clare doesn't escape fully just yet – she is still Vice Chair of our governors!

Attendance

As you know, one of the targets that OFSTED gave us in our last inspection was to improve attendance - particularly with regards to persistent absentees. A child is classed as being persistently absent if their attendance is below 90%. When their attendance is below this level, it means they are missing one phonics/reading session per fortnight, one maths lesson per fortnight and an English lesson per fortnight. This creates gaps in their learning which will hinder their education as they progress through school causing them reading, writing and maths difficulties. Hence the reason it was identified by OFSTED as such a key target for us.

Obviously the last few years have been massively disrupted by the pandemic and attendance figures nationally have been much lower than normal. However, with the improved Covid situation now, attendance has become a key target both nationally and for our school in particular as we await our next OFSTED inspection.

With this in mind, can I reiterate the importance of parents/guardians contacting school in the morning if your child is absent. This is a key requirement for all schools as part of normal safeguarding procedures. It also allows us to correctly code the absence. Without any notification, the absence is classed as unauthorised. Five unauthorised absences in a term can lead to a fine.

If there is anything that school can do to help with any attendance issue then please contact either me, Miss Jackson or Mrs Deakin.

Thanks for everyone who answered our questionnaire about our website. We will look to make changes when we upgrade our site next term. Lots of the things that parents requested such as information about classes, what the children were learning and links to purchase uniform are on the site.
